SUCCESS STORY



In order to guarantee a resilient, inclusive, competitive, and sustainable development in the face of climate change, the Peruvian government designed a participatory process named "Multisectoral Dialogue about the NDCs in Peru", which enables the implementation of Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs).

Climate change represents a global challenge that requires commitment, clear responses, and action from all key actors, whether they belong to indigenous groups, public or private sectors, civil society, academia, or international cooperation. Therefore, this model takes into account **three main characteristics for its implementation:**



To address NDCs adaptation and mitigation measures and involve concerned sectors.



To be a multi-actor and multi-level space bearing proper representation.



To focus on the creation of feasible agreements or alliances in order to implement NDCs.

ONGOING DIALOGUE

The participatory process for key actors to set up and implement NDCs in Peru in 2030 will be maintained and strengthened in the coming years. In this context, the participatory process "Multi-sectoral Dialogue about the NDCs in Peru" will be implemented in three stages:

All 3 stages of the process ensure that the key actors will appropriate NDCs in the implementation of adaptation and mitigation measures. Thanks to that, it will be possible to generate a critical mass that will contribute to the next NDC cycles of these contributions.



STAGE 1 2018 - 2019

Socialization and engagement of key actors in order to create alliances and mechanisms that manage the implementation of NDCs in 2030, **and prioritize enabling conditions and contributions to the specific mitigation and adaptation measures.**



The **results and achievements** made in each stage will be systematized and presented in a memory paper.

PERU NDCS

Peru demonstrated its leadership as it was the first Latin American country to ratify the Paris Agreement (July 22, 2016). The NDCs provide the objectives we are seeking as a nation and include a 20% reduction of greenhouse gas emissions (GHG) in 2030, including an additional 10% conditioned on international cooperation.

The "Multisectoral Dialogue about the NDCs in Peru" takes place in 4 formats: get-togethers, forums, work meetings, and executive breakfasts. In these events, roles and actions from all those involved -whether they are government entities or not- are arranged based on their needs, interests, and functions. Thus, the model makes all people involved appropriate, participate, and commit to the Peruvian response for climate change, which both validates and provides the sustainability of the NDC implementation process in the long run.

It is important to consider that this participatory process recognizes the particularities of the geographic, social, economic, political and cultural context in which they will be developed. Likewise, in all stages of the process, the cross cutting gender, intercultural and intergenerational approach will be consider and incorporated.

5 priority areas for adaptation

Health, fishing, and aquaculture, forests, agriculture, and water.

6 sectors in mitigation

Energy, transportation, industrial processes, agriculture, waste, land use, change in land use, and forestry (US-CUSS in Spanish).

NDCs are based on the Paris Agreement and they will allow the country to achieve SDG and absolve recommendations in order to access OCDF.

STAGE 2 2019-2020

Dissemination of the official mitigation and adaptation measures in order to **make agreements and create road maps** with actions and prioritized enabling conditions to be implemented in the short term (2019-2020).



This stage will focus on **strengthening the establishment of a shared vision** for low-carbon, climate-resilient paths to sustainable development on the part of the people involved in the implementation of NDCs.

STAGE 3 2020-2021

This supplementary stage will be developed as a way to **consolidate the process of dialogue and coordination between sectors** and created or existing instances with non-state actors.




Initiatives that ensure the fulfillment of mitigation and adaptation goals will be incorporated, and **new measures to be taken** for the next NDCs (which, according to the Paris Agreement, must be delivered in 2025) will be identified.

PERUVIAN MODEL

FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF NDCs

“Multisectoral Dialogue about the NDCs in Peru” seeks to build a participatory and social process so that Peru can achieve its mitigation and adaptation goals through the establishment of agreements among several actors.

MULTISECTORAL DIALOGUE ABOUT THE NDCs IN PERU HAS 4 TYPES OF FLEXIBLE FORMATS BASED ON ITS OBJECTIVES AND PRIORITIES



PARTICIPATION AND SOCIALIZATION

The larger the number of participants, the greater the chance of socializing and contributing to the management processes of the adaptation and mitigation measures.

AGREEMENTS AND ALLIANCES

The fewer the number of participants, the greater the chance of establishing new concrete agreements focused on laying out work plans or agendas with prioritized items.

LET'S TALK ABOUT NDCs SINCE THE BEGINNING

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES



Involve state and non-state actors so that they commit to the implementation of NDCs.



Incorporate initiatives that will contribute to the management in the face of climate change.



Consolidate strategic alliances among several actors.



Contribute to the generation of an informed critical mass that will get involved and will follow up on the implementation of NDCs.



Multi-level Public Sector: National, regional, and local.



Indigenous People: National and regional organizations.



Private Sector: Business associations, companies, and manufacturers.



Civil Society: NGOs, labor unions, citizen movements, professional associations.



Academia: Research centers and universities.



International Cooperation

AIMED AT KEY ACTORS IN CLIMATE CHANGE

March 2016

Creation of the temporary **Multi-sectoral Work Group** set up to generate technical information in order to improve the implementation of NDC (GTM-NDC), and it was comprised of **13 ministries and National Center of Strategic Planning (CEPLAN in Spanish)**.

August 2017

The Technical Secretariat receives an order from GTM-NDC to create a proposal for the participatory process.

October 2017

The National Commission on Climate Change (CNCC in Spanish) establishes the **creation of a special subgroup devised to contribute to the design of the participatory process** for the implementation of NDCs (with members of the civil society and the business sector).

March 2018

Approval of the "Multisectoral Dialogue about the NDCs in Peru" proposal.

June 2018

The first official stage of "Multisectoral Dialogue about the NDCs in Peru" is launched.

RESULTS OBTAINED SO FAR



Between October 2017 and June 2018, **11** events pertaining to the consultation workshop and contributions of GTM-NDC were carried out. After the approval of the model of the "Multisectoral Dialogue about the NDCs in Peru" participatory process in June this year, **15** more events were organized.

Between the years 2017-2018, thanks to the Peruvian government's commitment to promote this process, **26** "Multisectoral Dialogue about the NDCs in Peru" have taken place -in their different formats-, and more than **1,500** key actors have been called nationally, regionally, and locally from different interest groups.

The main results of this first stage are:



Contributions in the form of information delivery in order to design and create **Tentative Program documents** (road map of the adaptation and mitigation measures).



Creation of **communicational materials** to diffuse information and raise awareness on NDCs.



Identification of **investment and business opportunities** for the private sector and the business sector.



Dissemination of the proposals of NDCs adaptation and mitigation measures between government agencies and non-state actors.



An educated critical mass that knows about the process of NDCs, and it's also committed to participating in the implementation process of adaptation and mitigation measures.



Training in the **incorporation of a cross-cutting gender perspective** for public officials and consultants in charge of the creation of the Tentative Program documents, which describe and contain information about the adaptation and mitigation measures.



Coordination within and among government agencies **to define institutional arrangements, mechanisms, and an agenda with priority actions** to create Tentative Program documents.



Ongoing cooperation with **regional and national organizations of indigenous people and their actions** to be a part of the implementation process of NDCs.



International and national exchange of experiences that guide and provide input to the adaptation and mitigation measures.



LESSONS LEARNED FOR THE REPLICATION AND LARGE-SCALE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE MODEL

- Having explicit instructions for the incorporation of the key social actors for the implementation of NDCs through an official body facilitates the access and socialization of the Tentative Programs, as well as fundraising to “Multisectoral Dialogue about the NDCs in Peru”.
 - In order to design a proposal of engagement for key actors it’s necessary to identify the roles they have or are supposed to have in the measures and processes of NDCs, so that their call is launched properly and their participation is maximized.
 - Having an ad hoc committee to articulate, manage, and systematize the participatory process guarantees the incorporation of the results obtained in the “Multisectoral Dialogue about the NDCs in Peru” in the official documents of the government sectors involved.
 - In order to adapt the model to other processes where participation from different actors is required, the original project has to be organized and planned, and it should also have pre-designed and flexible methodologies and tools.
 - Having a technical communications support allows to effectively socialize the progress in the fulfillment of the NDCs and the participative process, at a national and international level.
